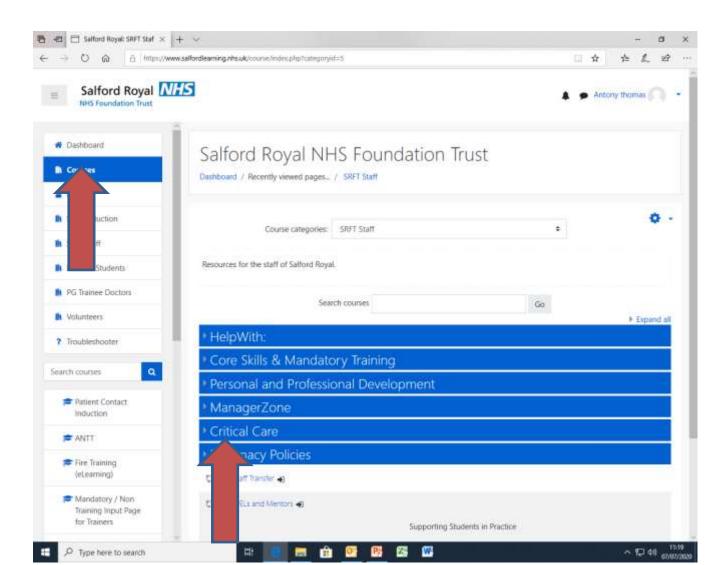
Delirium E-Learning- Why?

- Delirium is a very distressing condition that is common in the critical care unit.
- It is associated with an increased risk of death and long term disability.
- Patients may be suffering from delirium without this being obvious and so it has to be actively looked for.
- There are strategies to decrease the incidence of delirium and then mitigate its impact.
- These strategies can only be implemented if we know about them.
- Because of this all staff working in critical care should have a basic knowledge of how to identify, prevent and then manage delirium.
- We have produced an E-Learning course that should provide an introduction to the management of delirium and this course should be done by all new starters in critical care.
- The following slides explain how the E-Learning course can be accessed.

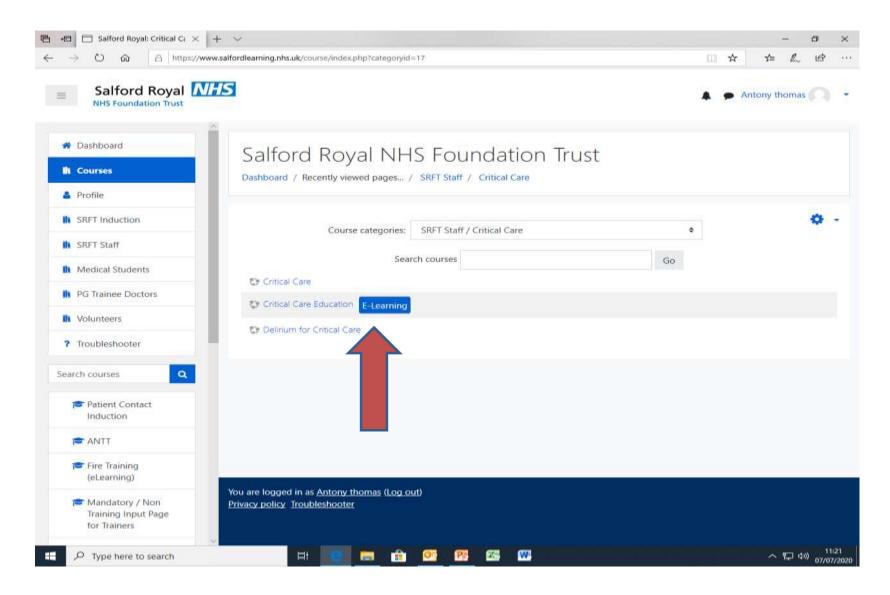

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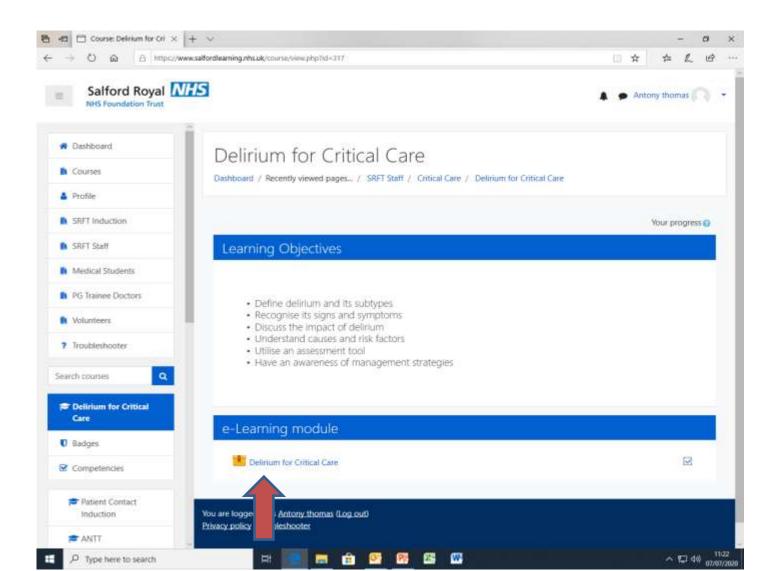
Select 'Courses' and then 'Critical Care'



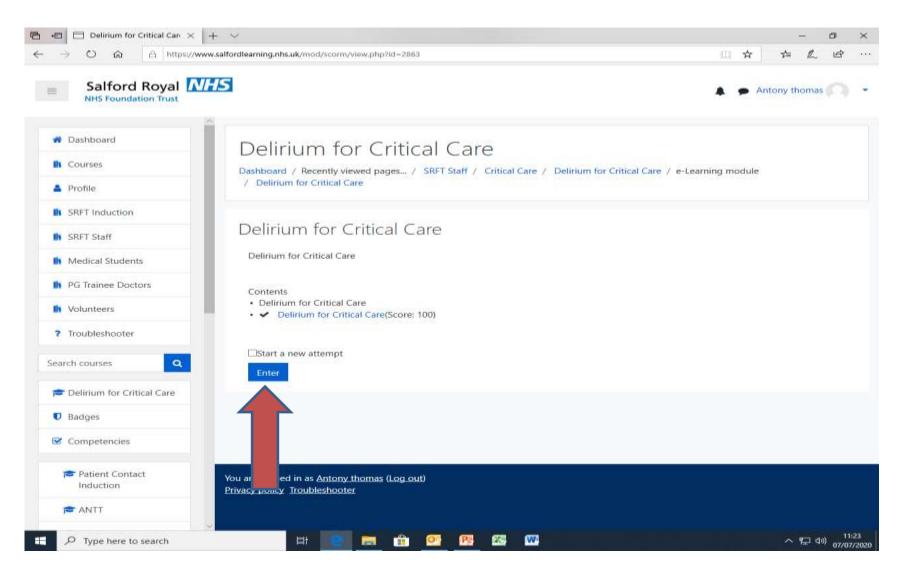
Then 'Delirium for critical care'
