What is a Patient Passport?

Patient passports are a tool aimed at patients in ICU.

It is a booklet which contains questions to help us to get to know your loved one better

We have questions on

- their requirements
- dietary preferences
- their hobbies and entertainment
- what is important to them

The passport is kept at the bedside for staff to use and you can choose to take it with you once your relative is discharged

Help yourself to a Patient Passport and take a look!

Why is it important?

While they are in ICU, your loved one may find it hard to communicate

We use patient passports to let us know what is important to your loved one so we can provide the best care possible

Who uses it?

The team looking after your loved one will use the passport. This includes nurses, doctors, physios, and other healthcare professionals
